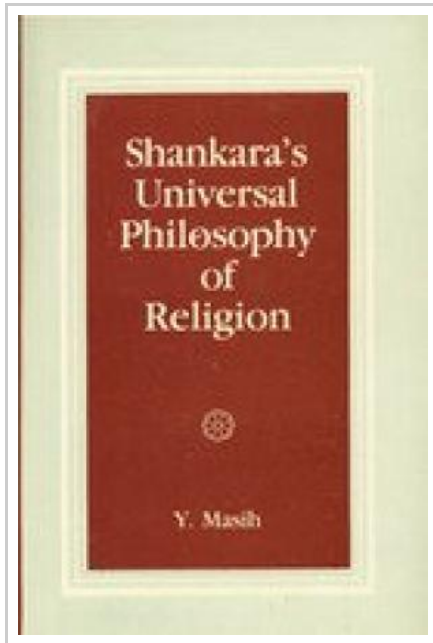




Shankara's Universal Philosophy of Religion
