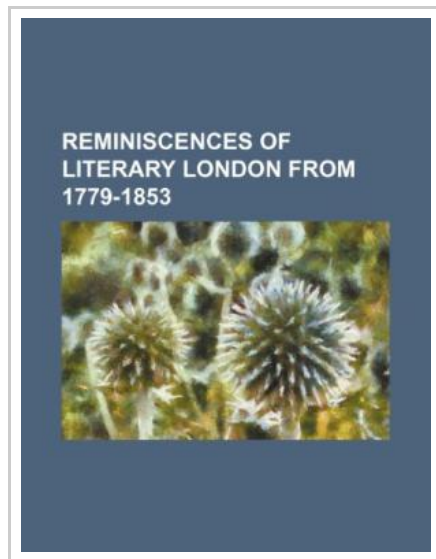




Reminiscences of Literary London from 1779-1853 (Paperback)
