Recently, Congress directed the Air Force to submit a request if it plans to use PIP funds for an alternate purpose. Modernization costs have increased dramatically in recent years. In fiscal Modernization Cost year 2001, the Air Force plan was to spend a total of 166 million for Increases upgrades to enhance the operational capabilities of the F A-22. Currently, Air Force plans in 2004 call for spending almost 3 billion through fiscal year 2009 for modernization projects. (See fig. 4). Most of the recent increase in modernization funding is necessary to provide increased ground attack capability. Other modernization projects include upgrading avionics software, adding an improved short-range missile capability, upgrading instrumentation for...



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
