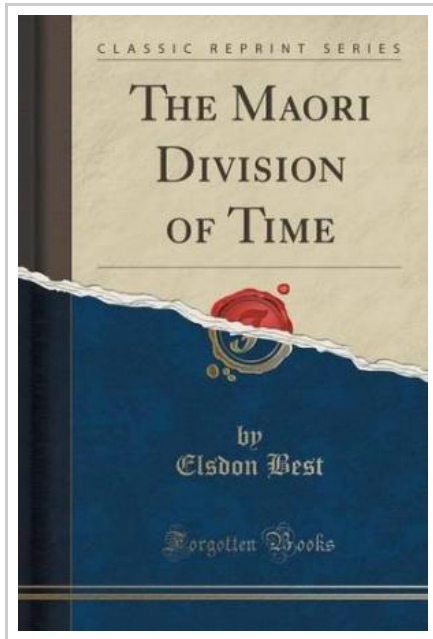

Hubbard wrote as follows: Early man naturally measured the year from the ripening of the crops of one year to the corresponding period in the succeeding year. Thanks to the investigations of Sir Norman Lockyer and Mr. Penrose, it has perhaps been established that this system of measuring time gave the early part of May as a starting-point for the year in ancient Egypt, as it had been in Chaldea in a still more remote period. Another authority, however, states that the Egyptian year commenced with the cosmic rising of Sirius, about the middle of July. The following extract is from Folk Lore, vol. xxv, No. 3: Ancient Celts and Teutons reckoned only two seasons in the year, and began it with the winter season in November, not with the summer season in May. This, obviously, is the practical husbandman s calendar, beginning the year with ploughing and ending it after harvest. It was during the autumn or early...
